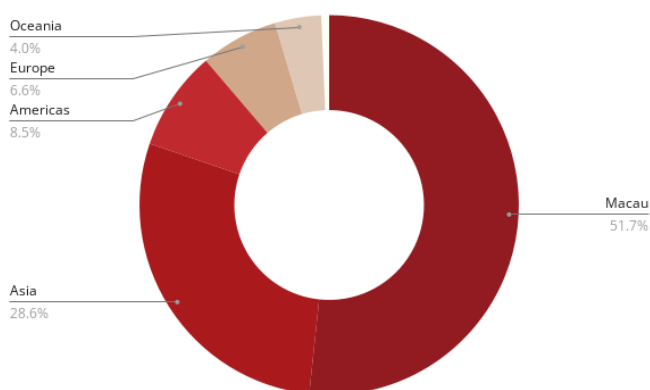

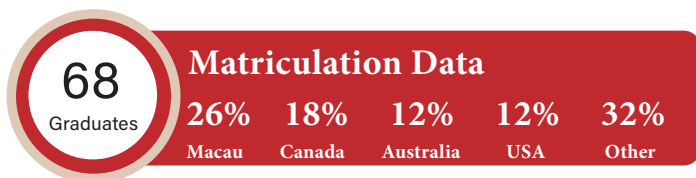

Macau

A former Portuguese colony, Macau is a densely populated, multicultural city-state. As the “Las Vegas of the East”, Macau maintains an educational system separate from both Mainland China and Hong Kong. Our families are a dynamic mix of expats and local Macau passport holders. Many of our students are ‘Third Culture Kids’ who travel seamlessly and extensively throughout the world.

Our Covid-19 Response

On January 27th, 2020 the Macau Government closed schools; Feb 3rd, 2020 we commenced online learning for all classes and our extra-curricular activities (ECAs) were suspended. The leaving exams from Alberta Education and from the IBO were cancelled. On May 4th, 2020 we resumed regular face-to-face lessons without ECAs and completed our school year. In 2021, we were unable to bring new teachers to Macau and several classes were taught remotely. We have a full compliment of staff in residence this year. We are confident that the grades students received were indicative of their mastery of each subject.

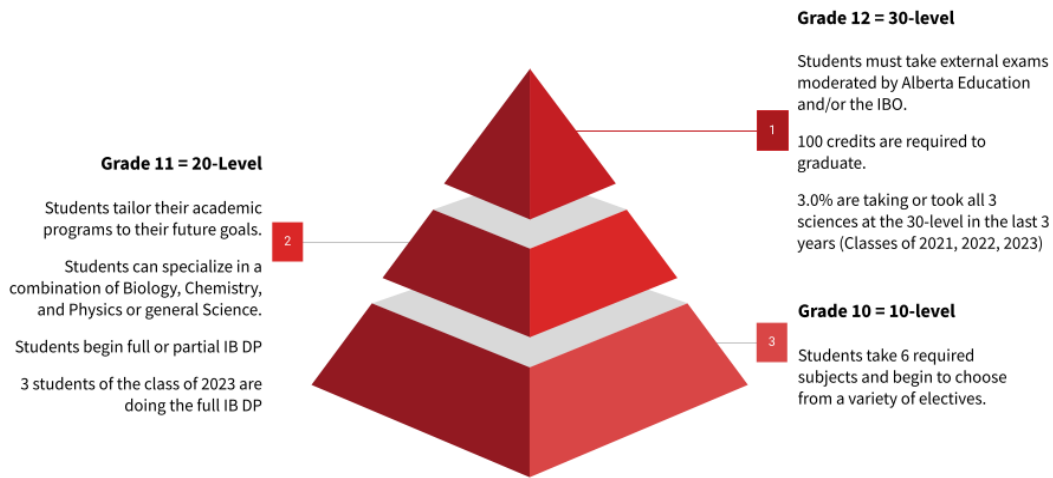

Graduation Options



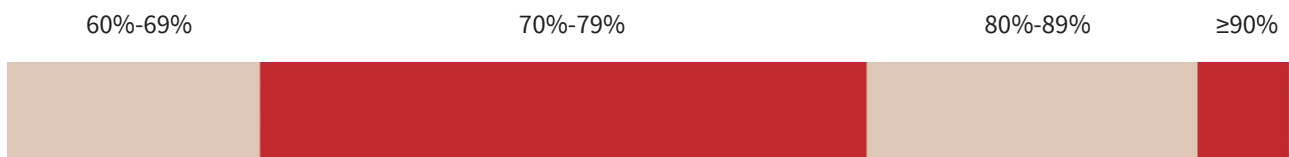
Grading Details

GPA's are normally reported on a 100%, unweighted scale of all courses. Letter conversions can be found on all transcripts. They encompass final marks from grades 10 and 11 only.

Final grades including standard exam results are available from the IBO on July 5th and from Alberta Education at the end of July.

Class of 2023 GPA Distribution

The Class of 2022 has 74 students. Their average GPA is 76.4% with the highest GPA being 96.7% Below is a distribution of overall GPAs for the Class of 2023 in grades 10 and 11.
