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




## Grading Details

GPA's are normally reported on a 100%, weighted scale of all courses. Letter conversions can be found on all transcripts. They encompass final marks from Grades 10 and 11 only.

Final grades including standard exam results are available from the IBO on July 5th and from Alberta Education at the end of July.
